**TRIAL ETHICS: DON'T RISK YOUR SOUL TO WIN A POINT**

Take Highway 101 North to 80 East (Bay Bridge/Downtown). Take the Fourth Street exit. Veer to the left onto Bryant Street. Turn left on Third Street, right on Mission Street. The school will be located two blocks down on the left.

### From the East Bay:

Take the Bay Bridge West to San Francisco. Take the Fremont Street exit. Turn left onto Fremont and then left onto Mission Street. The school will be located one block down on the right.
